## Day 1

# Queen Alia Airport - Amman

Al Athar representative, who will be waiting for you at the immigration area Upon your arrival to Queen Alia International Airport, will receive you with a warm greeting and will render an efficient assistance with visa and luggage collection, then smooth transfer to your hotel in Amman. Free time to rest and freshen up for dinner.

## Amman - Iraq Al Amir - Amman city tour - Ahl El Kahf


Begin your tour by exploring Iraq Al-Amir, with its ancient caves and Qasr al-Abd, carved into the cliffs. Opportunity to interact with local craftswomen at Iraq Al-Amir Women's Cooperative, then on to King Hussein park to visit the **Prophet Mohammad Museum** (PBUH), housing treasured relics. Prayer stop at King Hussein Mosque, Jordan's largest and most modern mosque, after that discover Amman's historical heart, start by panoramic views from Amman Citadel which contains Umayyad Palace, Byzantine Church, and the Temple of Hercules, then descend to the **Roman Theatre**: Still hosting cultural events today, from there walk through the **old markets of Amman** & Enjoy delicious local sweets (Gold Market, Kunafa Sweet, Vegetables Market,...), Continue to the modern Museum of Jordan to witness how Muslim Scholars contributed highly in the modern human civilization.

In the late afternoon, transfer to the cave of Ahl Al-Kahf (The Cave of the Sleepers). You will hear and feel the inspiring Quranic story of the young believers who slept for 300 years.

### Amman - Nabi Shuaib- Abu Obaidah - Tabqat Fahl & Yarmouk Battlefields

After breakfast, transfer to the **Shrine of Prophet Shuaib (PBUH)**, Enlighten your soul by honoring Prophet Shuaib mentioned 11 times in the Holy Quran. Driving to the blessed Jordan Valley the path leads us to the shrine of **Abu Ubaidah Amer bin Al Jarrah**, the "Trustee of the Ummah," praised by the Prophet (peace be upon him), Continue northwards to reach the battlefield of **Tabqat Fahl** (Pella) site of a pivotal battle of Fahl (AD 635) by which the Levant countries became Muslims. Finally we move on to explore the historic **Battlefield of Yarmouk**, where Muslim forces achieved a decisive victory against the Byzantine army (AD 636). Return to Amman.

## Amman – Al Mushatta – Al Qastal – Qatrana – Mu'tah – Al Mazar – Kerak – Petra

We begin the day with a step back in time at **Al Mushattah Palace**, a striking Umayyad-era ruin known for its intricate stonework and blend of Byzantine and Persian influence. Nearby, **Qasr Al Qastal** invites us to explore its early Islamic architecture and one of the oldest surviving mosques in Jordan. We then travel to **Qatrana Castle**, an Ottoman-era caravanserai that once served pilgrims and traders on the Hajj route.

The air turns solemn as we arrive at the **Mu'tah battlefield**, the sacred site where companions of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) were martyred in the famous battle between Muslim and Byzantine forces, at **Al Mazar**, visit the shrines of : of Zayd ibn Harithah, Ja'far ibn Abi Talib, and Abdullah ibn Rawahah (may Allah be pleased with them). Finally, visit **Kerak Castle**, before continuing towards Petra.

## Petra - The Rose Red City (Horse ride, Petra By Night)

Today we awaken in one of the New Seven Wonders of the World—Petra, our journey begins with a horse ride through the ancient entrance path, followed by a walk through the narrow, winding Siq, flanked by rose-colored sandstone cliffs. Suddenly, the majestic Treasury (Al-Khazneh) reveals itself—its grand façade carved entirely into the rock, leaving visitors breathless. We continue to explore the Obelisk Tomb, the Street of Facades, and the ancient theater, each monument whispering stories of the Nabataeans who once thrived here. In the afternoon, you will have free time to explore, reflect, pray, or even hike to the Monastery for those seeking panoramic views of Wadi Araba. In the evening, we return to our hotel for a short rest and dinner before returning back to Petra for the wonderful Petra By Night experience.

# Petra - Wadi Rum (4\*4) - Aqaba city tour

This morning, we leave behind Petra's mountains and head into the vast expanse of Wadi Rum—also called the Valley of the Moon. We embark on a desert safari with 4\*4 vehicles discovering the sites of El Ein, El Khazali & the Sand Dunes. As we sip sweet tea in a Bedouin tent, we feel a deep connection to this land's rhythm and resilience.

After this unforgettable experience, we continue south to Aqaba, Jordan's only coastal city on the Red Sea, with rich Islamic history, interact with local community and enjoy traditional meal, visit the old market, and Aqaba Castle.

### Agaba - Nabi Lut Cave - The Dead Sea

Today, we follow the route along the Araba Valley toward the sacred site believed to be **the Cave of Prophet Lut (PBUH).** Reflect on the story of Qawm Lut, then visit the nearby **Museum of lowest place on earth,** continue our journey toward **the Dead Sea**, the lowest point on Earth. Known for its mineral-rich waters, the Dead Sea has drawn seekers for healing purposes. Here you can float effortlessly on its salty surface, a rare experience both fun and therapeutic. The surrounding mountains glow in shades of amber as the sun begins to dip. At the hotel, guests can relax with optional spa treatments or simply rest by the pool. A nourishing dinner is served, followed by a calm evening of reflection and rejuvenation.

### The Dead Sea - Jerusalem ( Al Agsa Mosque )

Our spiritual journey deepens as we cross via **King Hussein Bridge** into the holy city of **Jerusalem**. Our first stop is **the Mount of Olives**, offering a sweeping panorama of Al Aqsa Haram, Jerusalem's wall and the old city. We then visit the serene **Rabaa Al Adawiyya** Mosque, named after the famous Sufi saint known for her devotion and poetry. Nearby, the **Salman Al Farsi** Mosque honors the companion of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) who played a key role in early Islamic history. Time for prayer at **Al Aqsa which includes in its haram the golden Dome of the Rock and Al Masjed Al Qebli.** 

Overnight in Jerusalem.

- Distance/Time: The Dead Sea Jerusalem (80 KM 4:00 Hours, including border formalities)













## Jerusalem city tour

Our morning begins in the heart of Al-Quds (Jerusalem) at the revered Al-Aqsa Mosque, the third holiest site in Islam and the first Qibla. We stroll across Al Haram Al-Sharif, which contains the golden Dome of the Rock, Al Masjed Al Qebli, the schools, the wells and Zawaya. The Dome of the Rock is the place from where Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) ascended to the heavens during Al-Isra' wal Mi'raj. From there, we walk through the Old City's cobblestone streets to visit the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, a deeply sacred site for Christians, just steps away stands Masjid Omar, built in peaceful recognition of Jerusalem's shared sanctity among faiths. These holy landmarks, side by side, tell a powerful story of unity, history, and devotion. Visit the three quarters of the old city including the Muslim, Christian & Jewish quarters.

#### Jerusalem - Bethlehem - Hebron

Today's journey takes us south of Jerusalem to **Bethlehem**, the birthplace of Prophet Isa (PBUH), where we visit the **Church of the Nativity**—one of the oldest continuously operating churches in the world. Inside its humble stone walls, we feel the presence of centuries of reverence and devotion. We then travel to **Hebron**, home to **Al-Haram Al-Ibrahimi** (Cave of the Patriarchs), housing the tombs of Prophets Ibrahim, Ishaq, Yaqub, and their wives (PBUT).

We also stop at the **Al-Khader shrine**, associated with the righteous servant known for his deep wisdom in both Islamic and Christian tradition. By sunset, we return to Jerusalem, filled with new memories and spiritual insight, and gather once again for dinner and rest.

# Jerusalem - Nabi Musa - The Dead Sea

We begin the day by bidding farewell to Jerusalem and making a heartfelt visit to the **shrine of Prophet Musa (PBUH)**, known as Nabi Musa, located 30 KM east of Jerusalem this peaceful site is known as the Pilgrimages Route.

After prayers and reflection, we cross back into Jordan, via **King Hussein Bridge**, the road leads us once again to the soothing shores of **the Dead Sea**, where the mineral-rich waters welcome us for one last moment of floating relaxation.

# The Dead Sea - Mount Nebo - Desert Castles - Amman

Today's journey begins at **Mount Nebo**, it is believed that Prophet Musa (PBUH) stood and viewed the Promised Land. From its summit, we take in the breathtaking panorama of the Jordan Valley, Jericho, and on clear days, even Jerusalem. This sacred hilltop, marked with ancient mosaics and a simple church, evokes a quiet sense of reverence and timeless perspective, visiting the nearby **La Storya Museum** will enrich our experience of the history of local life. From here, we continue east into the desert to discover the architectural wonders of the early Islamic period. **Qasr Al-Kharranah** greets us with strong symmetry and elegant arches, showcasing the desert sophistication of Umayyad design. Nearby, **Qasr Amra**—a UNESCO World Heritage Site—reveals vibrant frescoes & bathing rooms. As the golden afternoon light sets across the desert, we return to Amman for a warm dinner and a restful night in Jordan's bustling capital.
